During the pandemic, EFry has undergone many changes. We have tripled our staff, expanded our services to include Peer Programs, a large student placement program, Outreach and Housing programs. We have also partnered with One City Peterborough to offer a collaborated drop-in service Monday-Friday.

While many businesses and community members were hit hard during the pandemic, the need for services in the community skyrocketed. Our capacity has grown to now include all members of the community - men, women, gender-diverse individuals, and all members of the LGBTQ2+ community.

As a feminist agency, we strongly believe that feminism is about inclusivity. While we will still continue to offer programs and groups to women and female-identifying members of the community, we have also added a number of programs and groups for men and gender-diverse community members.

Our Vision

A world without prisons where those who experience systemic inequities are no longer criminalized.

<u>Our Purpose</u>

We provide gender-responsive community supports for people who have been, or are at risk of being, criminalized, while advocating for broader social change to prevent or provide alternatives to incarceration.

Our Guiding Principles & Values

The Elizabeth Fry Society of Peterborough is a feminist, abolitionist organization that believes in the liberation of women and gender-diverse people from oppression of all kinds.

We believe that systemic inequities driven by racism and colonialism, and their consequences, including poverty, violence, trauma, mental illness, and substance use, lead to criminalization.

Guided by these principles, we operate from the following set of core values:

- Dignity: We believe everyone deserves respect. We meet people where they are at, without judgement, and we see people for who they are, rather than the challenges they are faced with.
- Inclusivity: We welcome people of all backgrounds, identities, and needs. We work
 hard to make sure no one is turned away from our organization. We amplify voices of
 those with lived experience.
- Compassion: We treat people with care and empathy, and we honour the voices of lived experience.
- Collaboration: We work as a team within our organization, with service users, and with our community partners to address broader systemic challenges and pursue shared goals.
- Transparency: We operate in an open and accountable manner within our organization, with our service users and community partners, and with the public.


